

1. OUR MISSION:

WE PROVIDE FOOD, CLOTHING, MENTORING, & MINISTRY FOR OUR STRUGGLING NEIGHBORS TO IMPROVE THEIR STANDARD OF LIVING.

1. OUR MISSION:

IN ORDER TO PROTECT THE DIGNITY OF OUR CLIENTS, WE USE CAREFUL DISCERNMENT TO DIFFERENTIATE BETWEEN:

- RELIEF: MEETING AN URGENT NEED. TEMPORARY; NOT MEANT TO BE A LONG TERM SOLUTION. * TRAGICALLY, IN CHARITABLE CIRCLES, SIGNIFICANT AMOUNTS OF CASES ARE TREATED AS RELIEF SITUATIONS EVEN IF SOMEONE IS NOT TRULY IN NEED OF RELIEF.
- REHABILITATION: WORKING ON HELPING CLIENTS BECOME STABLE & SELF-SUSTAINING. GUIDING THEM BACK ON TRACK.
- **DEVELOPMENT:** WORKING WITH CLIENTS TOWARDS ONGOING, LONG-TERM CHANGE. GETTING THEM TO A BETTER POSITION THAN BEFORE.

2. HISTORY:

THE STORY OF **CVCCS** BEGAN WHEN A MAN STRUGGLING WITH HOMELESSNESS SOUGHT REFUGE FROM THE FREEZING PENNSYLVANIA WINTER TEMPERATURES INSIDE A LEOLA CHURCH.

THE PASTOR LEARNED THAT HOMELESSNESS AND POVERTY WAS A SERIOUS ISSUE FOR MANY IN OUR COMMUNITY.

THEREFORE, IN 2010, THE CONESTOGA VALLEY
MINISTERIUM (A COALITION OF LOCAL CHURCH PASTORS)
STARTED CVCCS. CVCCS INITIATED WITH SETTING UP
SEVERAL FOOD AND CLOTHING BANKS AT AREA CHURCHES.



2. HISTORY:

IN 2014, SEEING THE NEED TO CONSOLIDATE SERVICES UNDER ONE ROOF, CVCCS MOVED INTO THE LAPP ELECTRIC BUILDING ON GEHMAN LANE IN LANCASTER.

• THE GOAL WAS TO BE A **ONE-STOP-SHOP** FOR OUR NEIGHBORS IN NEED.





3. REAL LIFE STATS:

PEOPLE MAY BE UNDER THE IMPRESSION THAT THOSE LIVING IN POVERTY IN LANCASTER COUNTY PRIMARILY RESIDE IN THE CITY OF LANCASTER.

• BUT DID YOU KNOW, 70% LIVE OUTSIDE THE CITY?

LANCASTER COUNTY POPULATION: 536,494

- 10.2% LIVE BELOW THE POVERTY LINE; 10.3% IN CV SCHOOL DISTRICT.
 - 16% ARE CHILDREN.
 - 14.8% CHILD FOOD INSECURITY RATE.





3. REAL LIFE STATS:

THE "WORKING POOR"

THERE ARE A GROWING NUMBER OF PEOPLE WHO HAVE 'FALLEN THROUGH THE CRACKS' IN LANCASTER COUNTY, DESCRIBED AS THE "WORKING POOR."

- THEY MAKE TOO MUCH MONEY TO QUALIFY FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE AND ARE LIVING PAYCHECK TO PAYCHECK WHILE BARELY GETTING BY.
- ACCORDING TO THE UNITED WAY OF PA, 26% OF TOTAL HOUSEHOLDS IN LANCASTER COUNTY MAKE UP THE WORKING POOR.







Our food bank is **client choice** and provides to people in need that live or attend church in the CV School District and meet financial guidelines.

• Clients may use the food bank once every 30 days by appointment only. A personal shopper assists clients with navigating the aisles.

Our food bank is stocked with:

•Non-perishable foods •Fresh produce •Dairy •Meats

• Bakery items . . . and much MORE!

Uniquely, we give our clients everything they need to make full meals for breakfast, lunch, and dinner!

Our products are obtained largely through donations from individuals, churches, schools, and local businesses.

We also have strong <u>partnerships</u> with Giant, Sheetz, Flowers Baking Co., Central PA Food Bank, and Community Action Partnership.







Our clothing bank is **client choice** and provides seasonally appropriate **new & gently used** clothing to clients who live **anywhere in Lancaster County**, referred to us by an agency, school, or church.

- Adults may visit 2 times a year & children up to 4 times a year.
- First-time clients must obtain a referral from a school social worker, church, or agency.



Our clothing bank is client choice, and stocked with:

- •A variety of clothing •Shoes & socks
- •Coats, hats, & gloves •New underwear
 - •... and much MORE!

A personal shopper assists clients with navigating the racks of clothing, and folds and bags items for clients.

 Clothing Bank items are obtained through donations from individuals, churches, schools, and local businesses.



Lancaster County is home to one of 23 Church World Service (CWS) refugee and immigration offices in the United States.

CVCCS shares a special relationship with CWS as we partner to clothe Lancaster County refugees.









Rooted is an afterschool program for children, grades 4-5, in the CV School District.

- Students are referred to the program by a school counselor.
- If approved by their parent/guardian, each student is then paired, one-on-one, with a mentor for the program year (Tuesdays | September through May).

Rooted specializes in:

- . Mentorship
- . Character Development
 - . Structured Relaxation
 - . Biblical Teaching





We provide students who struggle with **food insecurity** in the CV School District with bundles of food to take home each weekend during the school year.

- The food bundles are prepared by our volunteers and include: 2 Breakfasts, 2 Lunches, 2 Dinners, Snacks and drinks.
- The food packed in the bundles are quick, individually sized items that can be easily prepared.





Every June through August, our Summer Lunch Club serves approximately **3,000** lunches to kids 18 and under in the CV School district facing food insecurity over the summer.

Meals are served several days a week at various locations deemed to have a high concentration of low-income housing.

• We partner with local churches who host our Summer Lunch Clubs either at their facility or a nearby public park.

Before the start of each school year, we provide backpacks and school supplies for families in need in the CV School District.

• Each year we give on average over 100 backpacks filled with school supplies.

Many neighbors have shared to provide this backpack & school supplies. We invite you to share & give back to our community!


Here are 10 ideas to get you started:

- 10. Use your manners; smile and say Hello!




Additionally, with every backpack given, we encourage kids to make a difference in the CV community through our "Back Pack Give Back" initiative!











Created in 2017, Back on Track assists hard-working families impacted by an unavoidable financial hardship.

- Back on Track offers clients customized financial counseling, limited financial assistance to address immediate needs, and mentorship in planning for a selfsustaining future.
- Back on Track clients also have access to our Food and Clothing Banks.







A recent Harvard University study reveals the following regarding loneliness in America:

- 36% of respondents reported serious loneliness (feeling lonely "frequently" or "almost all the time or all the time").
- Research also affirms that those in poverty especially lack meaningful relationships. Therefore, we give our clients the option of being paired up with a local church body they can connect with.







Birthday Bags are given out to our clients (adults & children) when they visit CVCCS close to their birthdays.

 You or your group can assemble Birthday Bags and drop them off at our facility.

Here's what Birthday Bags should include:

- Box of cake mix.
 - · Tub of icing.
- Party favor (bag of balloons, streamers, noise makers, etc.).
 - Disposable aluminum cake pan.
 - Decorative paper plates and napkins.
